

- 1 A large and impressive early 19th century French Empire-style porcelain urn, finely decorated with two main panels, the first showing the goddess Pheme playing the trumpet to a group of bathing mermaids and mermen, the second panel showing three sirens perched atop scrolling foliate motifs, above a sea filled with classical dolphins. Above the rope twist handles are panels showing nude winged boys carrying torches, possibly figures of Hymen, standing atop figures probably of Poseidon; around the top of the urn is a foliate pattern, and around the bottom is a pattern consisting of flowers and masks, 35cm high (lacking socle but bronze nut present) £500-700
- A large 19th century Chinese porcelain vase of hexagonal baluster form, with pomegranate form handles, decorated with a landscape scene, 58cm high £150-250
- A large 19th century continental pottery dish in gilt frame, painted with a scene of mother and child, attributed to Guido Bach and apparently formerly belonging to Herbert Beerbohm Tree and hanging in the Haymarket Theatre, the frame measuring 62cm x 62cm £300-400
- A large 19th century Chinese blue and white porcelain ginger jar, decorated with prunus blossom, 23cm high £100-150
- A rare pair of 18th century Chinese blue and white armorial plates, decorated with the arms of Lethieullier, circa 1730 with floral sprays, panels containing landscape scenes, and a further perched parrot crest at the top of each plate, 23cm diameter. The Lethieullier family dynasty was one of the richest merchant banking families in London during the 17th and 18th centuries (see Howard, Chinese Armorial Porcelain, page 174) £800-1,200
- A late 19th century French pâte-sur-pâte casket by Gibus & Redon, the top decorated with a classical scene, the sides with foliate motifs, brass-mounted and standing on four bun feet, marked to base, 19.5cm wide x 12cm high £300-400
- 7 An 18th century polychrome delftware plate, the centre decorated with an urn, 22.5cm diameter £50-70
- A Worcester miniature blue and white tea bowl and saucer, circa 1754-60, painted with the Rock Warbler pattern, painter's mark, the saucer measuring 8cm diameter £100-150

- 9 An 18th century Caughley porcelain blue and white chestnut basket decorated in the Pinecone pattern, with reticulated basket weave and applied handles and flower, 'C' mark to base, 24cm across £80-120
- An 18th/19th century blue and white tin glazed pottery vase, of reeded ovoid form, with painted segmented panels containing figures and flowers, 24.5cm high £80-120
- 11 A 19th century Chinese Canton famille rose porcelain plate painted with figures within a border of flowers and butterflies, together with a small 19th century Chinese blue and white double gourd vase painted with a foliate pattern, 14cm high (2) £50-70
- 12 Group of 18th century Chinese blue and white export porcelain, including a large two handled basket, tureen with associated cover, and two meat plates (4) £100-150

- 17 A Victorian George Jones majolica nut dish, of foliate form, with two large compartments and two small, the centre with a squirrel-form handle, marks to base, 35cm wide £100-150
- A trio of graduated Derby vases, polychrome decorated with floral sprays on a cobalt blue and gilt ground, the largest 14.5cm high £60-80
- A group of Staffordshire pottery figures and other items, including a pair of musicians, The Death of Nelson, a money box, etc £60-100
- A 19th century English pottery 'frog' loving cup, together with six 19th century English pottery jugs, including one agateware, one relief-decorated lilac ground, three lustre jugs, and one more (7) £60-100

- A large pair of 19th century Goldscheider polychrome decorated terracotta busts of Arab figures, marked to backs, 47cm high £600-800

Nichols and Plincke Biography:

In the mid-19th century, there existed a relatively large community of English gold- and silversmiths. Two such figures were Charles Nicholls and William Plincke, who together acquired a silver business from John Pickersgill in 1815 and rebranded it first as William Plincke's English Shop and later, in 1829, under both their names as Nicholls & Plincke. Having already been granted Russian citizenship in 1804, the pair gained further hereditary honorary citizenship forty years later.

Early on, Nicholls & Plincke received the royal warrant and a considerable number of imperial commissions, including many Christmas presents from Nicholas I to his family and the silver portion of his daughters' dowries. In 1852, the Imperial Court requested the creation of an impressive forty coffee services (A. von Solodkoff, Russian Gold and Silver, Trefoil Books, 1981, p. 200). They also co-produced the malachite fireplace in the Winter Palace. Though the firm's success stemmed from its sourcing of silver in England, it also had a reputation for fine enamel work. Notable workmasters include Samuel Arnd, J. Henrikson and A. Tobinov.

Unfortunately, Nicholls & Plincke was unable to withstand the pressure from their ferocious competitor, Fabergé, whose vast workforce could churn out production at a monumentally fast rate. The company fell into decline after suffering severe financial losses and was forced to close in 1880. £3,500-5,000
