

- 1 Jack the Ripper interest - Photograph with inscription purporting to be from the Ripper, the sepia photograph of an unidentified seated gentleman, the reverse with stamp mark for the photographer Mr Arthur Langton of Euston Road, and date 15 Dec '86. The scrawled note in blue crayon or similar reads 'I must find a cure for that dreadful disease in (Whitechapel), and will keep my knife nice and sharp, will strike again when time is right, perhaps in New Year'. Provenance: By descent from the vendor's late uncle who had a keen interest in the Jack the Ripper legend and read broadly around the subject, the previous origins of this lot are unknown but their family originated from the Whitechapel area of London. The present lot has been appraised by Ripper experts who consider it to be in all likelihood a fake but we leave it to bidders to reach their own conclusions £400-600
- A disarticulated human skull, housed in an Edwardian box with paper label for 'Adam, Rouilly & Co, Specialists in Human Bones, Anatomical Models, Charts. Provenance: Collection of Jonathan Gash, author of the celebrated 'Lovejoy' novels whose other profession was as a Director of bacteriology at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. £50-100
- A papier-mâché witch puppet, with hook nose and protruding chin, the black cloak painted in gilt with cats, crescent moons and stars, measuring 130cm including the handle £40-60
- A view of the Heavens: a set of thirty-two early 19th century celestial engravings on card by Sidney Hall (1788-1831), each depicting a constellation £100-150
- Homo sapiens a human skeleton, possibly used by medical students, connected by wire, with hanging hook at the top of the skull, 160cm tall £1,000-1,500

- Pair of spooky glass eye ball earrings in gilt metal mounts, perfect for seeing the dead £30-50
- Vintage 1940s bakelite telephone, purported to receive messages from the dead, the black type 328 telephone with alphabet dial and drawer to the base £40-60

- 9 The first of two rare 18th century lead church roof plaques, inscribed 'S: DEACON & W: HINES / CHURCH:WARDENS / E: PEARMAN / PLUMBER / 1773', measuring 77cm x 80cm £200-300
- The second of two rare 18th century lead church roof plaques, inscribed "J: KEMBALL / T: CHAPLIN / CHURCHWARDENS / J: FREWER / PLUMBER / 1782', measuring 70.5cm x 78cm £200-300
- 11 A model of a shrunken head, made with animal hide and human hair, made to resemble the shrunken heads of the Antipas tribe of the Amazon £100-150
- 12 Of murder interest: A metal lantern, believed to have been removed from Polstead's infamous Red Barn. Provenance: Vendor's father cleared the Red Barn in 1950s when this lantern was discovered £50-100
- A rare Victorian Gothic style silver plated table bell, in the form an owl perched on a branch over a group of toadstools, on a naturalistic base, inscribed 'EPNS' and 'Rd 31340', 18.5cm high £100-150
- 14 A collection of 24 18th century German engravings of serpents and reptiles, many hand-coloured £60-100
- A mechanical resin skull, with remains of hair and skin, believed to have been used as a film prop in the 1990s: powered by a 9v battery, the skull moves realistically and its jaw opens and closes. Guaranteed to cause nightmares if you gaze into the depths of his eye sockets for too long £100-150
- 16 Peter Benchley Jaws, 1974 first edition, with dust jacket showing the fearsome great white shark made famous by Steven Spielberg's Hollywood blockbuster £50-70
- 17 Homo sapiens: a group of bones in a Victorian mahogany casket, to include a pelvis, spine, foot, hand, tibia, etc. Some pieces joined by wire. Cause of death unknown but bones have purportedly been contained in this casket for several decades. £80-120
- An old pair of leather handcuffs with steel chain, possibly used for restraining patients in an early 20th century psychiatric hospital £40-60



- A Victorian memorial card: 'Sacred to the memory of Joseph Deane / Who died January 4th, 1864, / In his 38th year. / Interred in the Bow cemetery'. Made of cut and embossed paper and mounted on black, in a glazed maple frame, the card measuring 20cm x 16cm £50-70
- A Victorian silver plated witch's cauldron spirit burner, the three-footed cauldron with ivory knop, hanging on a chain suspended from three naturalistically cast branches tied together with rope, with burner beneath, 36.5cm high £100-150
- John D Aitchison, watercolour illustration of a tall wizard figure appearing before a seated committee of other witch and wizard figures all in a dimly lit hall, signed lower left and dated 1956, framed, 37.5cm x 27.5cm £40-60
- A set of thirty-six cards, including twelve zodiac and twenty-four other constellations, from Charles Hodges' "Astrophilogeon", circa 1828, wonderfully hand-coloured and with gilt edges, based on Urania's Mirror £200-300
- Collection of sixteen model skulls showing the ascent of man by Bone Clones £200-300
- 24 Eight modern Surrealist French monochrome prints of anthropomorphic creatures £30-40

- A grotesque three-legged pottery toad, covered with warts, glazed in tones of brown, in the style of Burmantofts, 15cm high. In Chinese folk mythology, the three-legged toad appears during a full moon and signifies good luck. £60-100
