





- Late 19th century American silver card tray of circular form with floral and scroll border and central engraved initials, by Tiffany & Co, marks circa 1892 1902, together with a letter of provenance, all at 3.5oz, 14.5cm in diameter £80-120
- George III silver cruet frame of rectangular form with reeded decoration and central handle, on four fluted feet, with six matching cut glass condiment bottles, including three with silver mounts. (London 1807) maker John Emes, frame all at 10.5oz, 21cm in height £100-150
- Contemporary silver dish in the form of a Vine leaf (Birmingham 1987) together with a silver pin dish and two silver sauce boats (various dates and makers) all at approximately 8.5oz £80-120
